Procedures for our discussion:

Shelter/Hold-In-Place	Evacuation	Lockout	Lockdown
Hold ALL students in CURRENT location. Check hallways for any students in transition. Close classroom door and continue as normal inside classroom	EXIT all students from the building. Follow fire drill procedures when an alarm sounds.	IMMEDIATE THREAT OUTSIDE the building. Students and staff outside should immediately re-enter the building. NO visitors may enter. Classes and change of classes continue as normal inside the school.	IMMEDIATE THREAT INSIDE the building. Check hallway for any staff or students and then LOCK door and get OUT of SIGHT. Remain in lockdown until released by police/administrator.



Shelter/Hold-In-Place	Evacuation	Lockout	Lockdown
 Hold ALL students in CURRENT location. Check hallways for any students in transition. Preachers & Staff check hallways, restrooms, adjacent common areas and move students into the nearest classroom or office. Note additional people in your room. Classroom teachers should "sweep" the room. If something looks unusual call ext 3000. Close the door and function as normal in the classroom. Pull down shades to prevent vision of students if something is occuring outside the building (ex. ambulance) No one is allowed to leave the rooms regardless of the bells. Remain calm and assure students there is no immediate threat. In case of classroom situations i.e. panic attacks, sickness, obvious restroom emergency. Call ext 3000 or School nurse. Administration will announce when to resume normal status or next steps. 	 EXIT all students from the building. >Follow fire drill procedures when an alarm sounds. >Exit the room with class, closing all doors behind you. Bring "grab-n-go" materials including rosters and communication devices (radio, cell phone, Chromebook). >Stress quiet, orderly and rapid evacuation. Students should not be using their cell phones. > Take attendance of students & adults once arriving at the evacuation site. > Remain in place until directed to return inside OR the need to relocate off site. > Possible relocation sites: See building level safety plan 	NO visitors may enter the building. Students and staff outside should immediately re-enter the building. >Once inside, take attendance of students & adults. Report any missing to the main office. >Students, teachers & staff will have classes and change of classes inside the school as usual. >Anyone ENTERING OR EXITING the building will need to do so at the Quade Street entrance and with approval of the designated person stationed at the door during a lockout.	 IMMEDIATE THREAT - Check hallway for any staff or students and then LOCK door and get OUT of SIGHT. >Teachers & Staff do a visual sweep of hallways & adjacent common areas and move students to the nearest classroom or office. >Close & Lock classroom/office doors & windows >In the classroom-move students to any location where they cannot be seen through the door/window. If possible, add a temporary cover to the window, pull shades and turn off lights. >Do Not unlock or open your door under any circumstance. >Remain silent. Take attendance. Note names of missing and/or adults. Do Not: -communicate through door or phone -respond to the P.A. or other announcements. >Students & Adults outside the building are to remain outside - immediately moving away from the building. Walk to i and await direction for next steps. >If a medical emergency occurs dial 911 and the police department will respond to the emergency

B Review of this week's incidents

- We **cannot discuss specifics** regarding the students involved in either incident
- The students are receiving appropriate supervision/care
- Disciplinary procedures are already underway according to district and school policy
- In similar cases, students cannot return to campus after incidents of this nature

Incident at the High School on 9/8/22

Dear Parents and Guardians,

This morning, our high school students were gathering to begin their day with a scheduled outdoor lunch at the school's front entrance and on the lawn. At approximately 11:20 a.m., one student obtaining lunch in the cafeteria was twice directed to leave the building. While outside, the student damaged some music speakers, and was asked to leave the campus. The student proceeded around the building to a different locked entrance, and knocked on the door until an unrelated/unknowing student opened the door. Once inside, the student put on a face mask and walked down the hallway, where he engaged in an altercation with the school's hall monitor and principal. The High School immediately called for a lockout, and the adjoining Middle School called for a shelter-in-place until the situation was resolved.

During this altercation, a BB gun fell out of the student's backpack and onto the floor. Glens Falls' School Resource Officer was nearby, and called for additional assistance from the Glens Falls Police Department to remove the student from the school. Appropriate disciplinary actions for the student are already underway, in accordance with district policy.


Br High School incident on Thursday, 9/8/22

- Safety Council (Building and district representation, NYSIR rep, FD/EMS, and PD) debriefed Monday (9/12) on incident response strengths and weaknesses
- Both immediate and longer-term changes were discussed, and are being implemented


- Added HS staff member supervision from 8:05-8:25 a.m.
 - High School front sidewalk/entryway
 - "C" Door to monitor arrivals and send people to "A" Door for entry
 - "G" Door hallway (sports)
 - "A" Door main entrance
 - Cafeteria for student breakfast service
 - 7:25 a.m. breakfast service for BOCES students before bus
- BOCES and off-campus program buses now pick-up/ drop-off at "A" Door (front entrance) of High School.

- MS + HS students will need to use **lockers** to store backpacks during the day
 - There are 774 lockers in the Middle School, and 1628 lockers in the High School.
 - Lockers were fully replaced with new units in the summer of 2019 (as part of the 2017 Capital Project)




- Locker use had been optional; coordination was needed to assign lockers to every student
 - MS students (7th/8th Grade) began using lockers on Thursday, 9/15
 - HS students received locker assignments and info today in extended homeroom (Friday, 9/16)

- Details on backpack storage:
 - Backpacks can be used to bring school materials, lunches, sports/activity items, etc. to and from school.
 - Students will not be allowed to carry their backpacks from class to class.
 - Students will have to place their backpacks in their assigned lockers as they enter the building.

Law enforcement sweeps of lockers

- Details on backpack storage:
 - As a reminder, the Middle and High Schools conduct regular safety drills which may include K-9 sweeps of hallways and lockers.
 - K-9 units from the Glens Falls Police Department, Hamilton Co. Sheriff's Office, and Washington Co. Sheriff's Office participate

At 10:09 a.m. this morning, the Middle School, and shortly thereafter, the High School entered into Lockdown. A Middle School student reported to a social worker that they saw what looked like a weapon fall out of another Middle School student's backpack. All students and staff members secured in classrooms, while administrators and police identified and located the student. GFPD officers secured the student, and recovered a toy replica gun from the student's backpack. The student was taken into GFPD custody and removed from the building.

Within minutes of the situation being reported, all district buildings were placed into a Lockout, as a precaution. All Lockdowns/Lockouts have now been lifted (11:05 a.m.). Additional details on this incident will be forthcoming shortly. The Middle School is still in "shelter in place" while further investigation continues.

Followup to 9/14/22 lockdown at GFMS/GFHS

In response to the safety situations on Thursday and today, the district is **instituting bag checks for all students entering the High School and Middle School in the morning, beginning tomorrow, Thursday, September 15, 2022.** Students will be asked to place their backpacks/bags on a table at their entrance door, where a school staff member will search the contents of the bag before allowing the students to proceed into the building. If students have anything in their bags that shouldn't be there (such as a weapon or drugs, as defined in the <u>GFHS Code of Conduct</u>, and <u>GFMS Code of Conduct</u>) the item will be confiscated, and the student will immediately face disciplinary procedures as outlined in the codes of conduct. School community members will likely see an increased law enforcement presence on the H5/MS campus tomorrow as these new procedures get going.

Parents, guardians, students, staff, and families are encouraged to attend a school community meeting taking place this Friday (9/16/22) at 6 p.m. in the High School auditorium.

These incidents require all of us to take immediate and longer-term steps to reinforce the culture of safety at all of Glens Falls' schools. Some of these steps were outlined at the Board of Education meeting on Monday night (presentation slides <u>here</u> (2), and include:

- District-wide faculty/staff meeting Wednesday afternoon (9/14) to immediately assess known information
- Both immediate and longer-term changes were discussed, and are being implemented

• Bag checks for all students entering the High School and Middle School in the morning



• We are trying to find the balance ... together!



- Long lines/backup for bag checks Thursday
 - Immediate adjustment: two entry doors for High School on Friday
- Bag checks complete at both HS entrances by 8:39 a.m. Friday; Middle School checks complete by 8:45 a.m.
 - Better, and we're working on it

Morning bag checks moving forward


- HS/MS bag checks will continue indefinitely
- Option being discussed: Move to random bag checks upon entry (every few students)
 - Move to indoor screenings to remove congregations of students outside
- Option being discussed: Metal detector wands

Longer-term changes moving forward

- Adding Safety Monitor position at HS, with duties closer to security
- HS/MS student ID badges
 - Possibly with barcode to allow scanning upon building entry/exit, in lunch line, GGTA, etc.
- Mobile safety app for all school staff members; additional training

Longer-term changes moving forward

- Raptor Visitor management system being installed soon, in all buildings at entry point
 - Scans visitor drivers licenses, instant sex offender check, prints visitor badge with photo

1. Introductory Materials

Plan Development and Maintenance

8 NYCRR Section 155.17 (b) and 155.17 (c)(11) – requires that each school shall have a Building Level School Safety Team that consists of representatives from the following groups: teacher, administrator, and parent organizations, school safety personnel and other school personnel, community members, local law enforcement officials, local ambulance or other emergency response agencies, and any other representatives the board of education, chancellor or other governing body deems appropriate.

Purpose of a K-12 Security Assessment

Armoured One's mission is to save lives. Our goal is to deter, prevent, defend, and protect against an individual or individuals who are targeting a building and its occupants in an active assailant or deadly aggressive behavior incident. The specific location for this report is 10 Quade 5t, Glens Falls, NY 12801. The recommendations will help create cover or concealment from an attacker, buy time for the innocent to react, notify building occupants quickly, and increase the chance of survival. This report is meant to increase your security posture by taking a comprehensive approach to violent threats. Armoured One's security assessments are specifically focused on areas in need of improvement based on actual, real-life case studies of past active shooters at schools in the United States. The history of attacks at schools helps determine security improvements for a safer work environment. It also helps in developing an effective security plan or an

Our recommendations are developed and reviewed by subject matter experts in active shooter and physical security from law enforcement officers, homeland security, FBI, Secret Service, DEA, retired Navy SEAL Master Chief, and SWAT Team members. We also consult with architects, engineers, teachers, code enforcement, school administrators, fire, EMS, and emergency management. These recommendations are made to slow down an attacker and to speed up law enforcement's response to the attacker. Attacks on schools have increased over the past 20 years and buildings need to adapt and learn from these attacks. There is no single change or improvement that will protect a school from an active assailant. A holistic approach should be considered when preparing and preventing a targeted attack while considering slowing down the attacker, speeding up law enforcement response to the attacker, and notifying building occupants quickly and

Armoured One also supports and encourages prevention methods such as threat assessment teams, anonymous tip lines, and promoting "see something, say something". We make the recommendations, but the responsibility falls on the organization itself to make the changes, offer training, and protect the students, staff and visitors. This security assessment was completed from the property line to the interior of the building. Each area of examination shows the existing conditions, good current practices, vulnerabilities, recommendations, and real-life examples. A summary of recommendations is also included at the end of this document. We have also provided a supplemental document that helps further explain our recommendations. We strive to balance securing the building while maintaining aesthetic and functional appeal. As with any public access building,



Proactive approach to student well-being

- GoGuardian: a security software on Chromebooks that alerts administrators if students indicate an intent to harm themselves or others
 - ie. web searches



Proactive approach to student well-being

- Social worker/psychologist teams in each building
- Community-building and restorative **Circles**, aided by Mediation Matters training
- Meeting "whole-child" needs:
 - HOPE Boutique
 - All free meals via federal funds
 - School supplies, Chromebooks, etc.

Proactive approach to student well-being

- Care Solace: a concierge service to connect students/staff/families to mental health and substance abuse treatment **providers**
 - Help find a therapist
 - Coordinate appointments
 - Follow up with families

Specific post-lockdown student support

- Social work/psychology teams provided support in a variety of settings in both MS and HS
 - 20 students were provided one-to-one or small group support
 - 13 MS students
 - 7 HS students
 - Majority of those students reported negative feelings about the incident itself, not the way the lockdown was handled.

Longer-term efforts moving forward

- Superintendent's **Student Cabinet** 14 members signed up, first meeting within next two weeks
- Rachel's Challenge assembly & leadership training for all MS and HS students on Wednesday, 9/21
 - Rachel's Challenge is a national nonprofit dedicated to making schools safer, more connected places where bullying and isolation are replaced with kindness and respect. It is based on the life and writing of Rachel Scott, the first victim of the Columbine tragedy in 1999.
