

Post-Star to end print daily

As of July 11, The Post-Star says it will publish a print paper only on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. The other

days it will be strictly digital, said an article in Sunday's paper headlined, "Your expanded

Post-Star coming soon."

"In addition," said the long unsigned article, "your newspaper will transition from being delivered by a traditional newspaper delivery carrier to mail delivery by the U.S. Postal Service."

The Post-Star said "every print edition will be an expanded edition, with more content, more sections and more pages."

GF Black Bear had 'em hooting

Chronicle Managing Editor Cathy DeDe writes: Monday night, Glens Falls School District revealed its new Black Bears mascot in a brief, dramatic roll-out before a noisily appreciative crowd in the auditorium.

Several versions of the "Black Bear" — from a growling head shot above the banner "Glens Falls Nation" moniker, to a "GF" logo seemingly gripped from behind by a fierce bear claw — flashed on the large screen.

People seemed especially to like the bear claw.

A costumed Bear in signature Glens Falls red-and-black danced on stage, riling up the small crowd — and later posed for pictures with enthusiastic children.

Next week, Superintendent Krislynn Dengler announced, "Every student in Glens Falls, from Pre-K to 12th Grade, will receive their own Black Bear tee shirt," courtesy of The Glens Falls Foundation, Finch Inc., and Hallwear.

The logos were designed by VIP Branding, District spokesperson Skye Heritage told *The Chronicle*.

She said VIP is affiliated with BSN Sports, which provides athletic equipment "and a few uniforms" to Glens Falls and that "VIP Branding offered its services for free to any school district in New York required to retire their Native American imagery due to the directive from the State Education Department."

"The design process went through many rounds of revisions, with Student Cabinet members, district leaders and others in our school community providing input."

Dr. Dengler, student cabinet members and Athletic Director Shane Jones raised the common theme of "Unity" exhibited over the six-month mascot process.

"The focus was on the students and the next generation," Mr. Jones said. "...The high school students were very thoughtful of middle school and elementary students in this process as well."
